- providing a new space for debate and evidences to educational policies.

B.09. Education for integration: Migration, reception and integration as factors of development and social transformation

Discussing about immigrant reception and integration today means confronting a theme of great educational and cultural value. In many European countries, Italy included, populist sentiments are emerging, generated and nurtured by emotional reactions and fears. These sentiments are difficult to contrast without adequate educational actions targeted both to the migrants and to the recipient societies. As a matter of fact, in the current political debate, migrations are frequently associated with national security and dangers of "invasion", more than to the cultural and social enrichment that could derive from the implementation of effective integration policies.

The integration of migrants and refugees in our societies could, instead, contribute to tackle the problems of our fragile peripheries, the phenomena of massive emigration, the processes of demographic aging, the decline of certain productive sectors and the loss of manufacturing and artisan traditions. Many experiences, documented in academic literature as well as by the institutions and the non-profit world, demonstrate that effective reception and integration policies can turn into powerful vectors of development and social transformation. Their educative value is evident in the generation of new forms of civil cohabitation, when individuals and communities understand that immigration is not an emergency to manage, but rather a structural phenomenon characterizing our time.

It is essential that positive experiences and effective policies be communicated and shared, so to start a virtuous cycle of knowledge exchange and avoid situations where only negative events, difficulties, criticism, ineffective and corrupted management are reported to the media and shared with the civil society. The goal of this panel is to describe and analyze some tiles of the mosaic of good reception and integration initiatives in Italy and/or in other European countries. We would like to highlight the initiatives and continuous efforts of thousands of people who work in the systems of immigration management, emphasizing that integration is, first of all, a "battle" of cultural education in which not only institutions should engage, but also all components of society, in order to create shared values and experiences.

For this track we will evaluate proposals for contributions on the themes of reception and integration. In particular, we expect to receive:

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- theoretical reflections on the concepts of immigrant reception and integration and their educational value;
- policy papers: analysis and evaluation of policies and/or practices and/or models of reception and integration, also in a comparative view;
- research papers: presentation of research projects on immigrant reception and integration, discussion on the findings and their practical implications;
- descriptive papers and/or narratives of reception and integration experiences at a local/national/international level, also with the purpose of sharing best practices.

ABSTRACTS SUBMISSION

HOW TO SUBMIT

Abstracts should be submitted by February 28, 2019 (check Dates and Deadlines).

Abstracts should to be edited in the **template form** (<u>click to download</u>) and then submitted via the <u>submission</u> <u>platform</u>.

Please do not submit your abstract by e-mailing it to the Convenor(s) of the track session you chose. Convenor(s) will receive submitted abstracts automatically from the submission platform and they are going to reject all the abstracts sent to their e-mail addresses.

Abstracts should include:

- 1. Title (limited to 20 words in UPPER CASE);
- 2. author's name and surname, institution and email address;
- five keywords;
- 4. abstract's text (limited to 500 words).
- The presenting author can submit **only 1 abstract** at the Conference.
- You may be co-author of a second, third ... n^{th} ... submitted abstract only in case you are not the submitter of this latter.
- Submitters that are accepted for oral presentation will be permitted to give only 1 oral presentation.
- The submitting and presenting author must be listed as the first author in the template form.
- Please note the submitting author will receive all correspondence about the abstract so we advise that the submitting author details that are entered are the same details as those of the presenting author.
- Abstracts may not be edited/updated after final submission. You are welcome to bring an updated abstract onsite with you at the Conference.

Before you begin, please prepare the following information:

- Abstracts must be allocated to a specific track session and therefore you have to select and report track session's code and title in the <u>template form</u>. For a complete listing of track session please <u>click here</u>.
- Abstract layout in the <u>template form</u> has the following sections: Methods, outcomes, references. However, suggestions are not obligatory. Word count is affected by inclusion of references.
- Convenors and the Scientific Committee will review all submitted abstracts. Notification regarding abstract acceptance and scheduling will be sent to the submitting author
- Please note, if your abstract is accepted for oral presentation, the presenting author will be permitted a maximum of 20 minutes oral presentation in the program.

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
