D.9 READING, READERS, CULTURAL CONSUMPTION: INEQUALITIES, LONG-TERM REPERCUSSIONS, POLICY INTERVENTIONS

The aim of the panel is to collect contributions relating to the sphere of reading literacy and reading practices, understood as a basic competence for inclusion and participation in social life, civic participation, also in relation to the relative risk of falling back into educational poverty in consequence of low literacy levels.

Papers addressing the genesis and development of social inequalities with respect to levels of literacy, the long-term effects of poor language skills, the combination of inequalities in reading literacy skills and other types and forms of inequalities are therefore welcome.

The panel aims to accept empirical analysis contributions on inequalities in literacy skills and in consumption practices (reading in leisure time, interest in reading, reading-related activities, etc.), based both on international comparative data, such as analysis based on databases such as PIRLS, PISA, PIAAC and on research (quantitative and qualitative) at the national or local level.

Further elements of interest for the panel are compensatory policies with respect to the reading skills of both student and adult population. Contributions illustrating effectiveness and impact of both macro-policies and micro and school-level policies are also welcome.

Proposals must therefore be based on empirical evidence (whether qualitative or quantitative), focusing on the issue of inequalities of competence in relation to ascriptive factors (gender, socio-economic and cultural capital, migratory background, geographical or contextual factors etc.) and/or school policy (national and local curriculum, tracking, streaming, ability grouping, etc.).

Contributions framing inequalities in reading skills related to school careers, educational choices, accumulation during life-courses, according to the idea that small initial deviations can produce increasing differences later in life, may be of particular interest.

HOW TO SUBMIT

ABSTRACTS/PAPERS should be submitted by **April 4, 2021** (check Conference Dates and Deadlines). ABSTRACTS/PAPERS should be submitted via the <u>pre-conference tool</u>.

Please <u>do not submit your ABSTRACT/PAPER by e-mailing it to the Convenor(s)</u> of the Panel session you chose. Convenor(s) will receive submitted ABSTRACTS/PAPERS automatically from the <u>pre-conference</u> <u>tool</u> and they are going to reject <u>ABSTRACT/PAPER</u> submitted to their e-mail addresses.

Language for ABSTRACTS/PAPERS is English.

You can submit an ABSTRACT or in case you prefer a PAPER. <u>Be careful</u>: **DO NOT SUBMIT BOTH ABSTRACT AND PAPER**. EITHER YOU SUBMIT THE FORMER OR THE LATTER.

ABSTRACT/PAPER should include:

- 1. Title (limited to 20 words in UPPER CASE)
- 2. Author's name and surname, institution, and email address
- 3. Five keywords
- 4. ABSTRACT's text (limited to 500 words). In case you decide for the PAPER, text will be 3.500 words min. 5.000 words max. In the submission text, please write: ABSTRACT or PAPER after the title. Example: FAMILY BACKGROUNDS AND STUDENT ENGAGEMENT IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS. A CASE STUDY (PAPER)

The Conference formula is: 1 SUBMISSION = 1 FEE (check FEES webpage)

It is possible to submit a maximum of 2 ABSTRACTS/PAPERS per person (double submission must concern 2 different Panel Sessions). Each ABSTRACT/PAPER is eligible if it is backed by an APP FEE.

Co-authors who do not submit ABSTRACT/PAPER as first author may access to the Conference via the discounted P FEE (check FEES webpage).

The submitting and presenting author must be listed as the first author in the <u>pre-conference tool</u>. Please note that the submitting author will receive all correspondence about the ABSTRACT/PAPER. Therefore, we recommend that the submitting author details that are entered are the same details as those of the presenting author.

ABSTRACTS/PAPERS may not be edited/uploaded after final submission.

Before you submit, please make sure the following requirements are met:

- ABSTRACT/PAPER must be allocated to a specific Panel session. Therefore, you must select the proper Panel when submitting. For a complete listing of Panel sessions please **click here**.
- If possible, write your ABSTRACT/PAPER highlighting methods, outcomes, references. Word count is affected by inclusion of references.
- Convenors and the Scientific Committee will review all submitted ABSTRACTS/PAPERS. Notification regarding acceptance and scheduling will be sent to the submitting author via the pre-conference tool.

Please note, if your ABSTRACT/PAPER is accepted, you will be permitted a maximum of 20 minutes for oral presentation.
