I.5 MASCULINITIES IN THE CLASSROOM: GENDER IMBALANCES AND NEW MODELS

Over the last decades, an increasing body of literature has focused on new models of masculinity as essential features towards an inclusive society, free from discrimination, inequality, and violence. One of the most fruitful consequences of such debate is the widespread recognition of the need for a reflection on masculinity in education, especially in schooling. In fact, among all the problematic aspects, the unresolved issues and the contradictions in the Italian school, the critical consideration of masculinity models in the hidden and visible curricula, as well as gender balance in teaching, are perhaps the most urgent.

The panel calls for papers first addressing the lack of men in the learning and professional fields of education and care. Italian schools have been, for at least half a century, "in the hands of women", who in the kindergarten represent almost the totality of the teaching staff and never drop below 75% of teachers up to lower secondary school. What are the consequences of such imbalance?

Secondly, the panel calls for papers addressing the emergence and the resistance to discussion of new models of masculinity within the school context. The lack of men in the teaching sector can be considered an indicator of a plurality of elements in the labor market, but also of gender stereotypes which, on the one hand, can have important repercussions on society, and on the other, can be configured as a real deprivation of training and work opportunities for young men. Professions such as teacher and educator seem to be "unsuitable" for men because, following a dichotomous logic, the characteristics of these professions do not by definition belong to the male gender and even risk appearing to be harmful to men's personal identity. A wide discussion on masculinity in education thus allows to question the obvious and validate new social outlooks and unprecedented individual projects.

The distance of men from educational contexts represents a pedagogical, social and cultural challenge. We need to address it by analyzing the multiple causes, outcomes, and consequences, as well as the social and cultural factors that continue to reshape it. Attention must then be paid both to relationships in the classroom, understood as a place for the exhibition and



co-construction of gender meanings, and to curricula, official and hidden, full of stereotyped and unbalanced contents, often taken for granted. Papers addressing these topics in a theoretical perspective, but also based on empirical and educational research, are very welcome.

Language for ABSTRACTS/PAPERS is English.

You can submit an ABSTRACT or in case you prefer a PAPER. Be careful: DO NOT SUBMIT BOTH ABSTRACT AND PAPER. EITHER YOU SUBMIT THE FORMER OR THE LATTER.

ABSTRACT/PAPER should include:

1. Title (limited to 20 words in UPPER CASE)

2. Author's name and surname, institution, and email address

3. Five keywords

4. ABSTRACT's text (limited to 500 words). In case you decide for the PAPER, text will be 3.500 words min. 5.000 words max. In the submission text, please write: ABSTRACT or PA-PER after the title. Example: FAMILY BACKGROUNDS AND STUDENT ENGAGEMENT IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS. A CASE STUDY (PAPER)

The Conference formula is: 1 SUBMISSION = 1 FEE (check FEES webpage)

It is possible to submit a maximum of 2 ABSTRACTS/PAPERS per person (double submission must concern 2 different Panel Sessions). Each ABSTRACT/PAPER is eligible if it is backed by an APP FEE
